PROCLAMATION OF THE WORD

Please be seated.

FIRST READING

A reading from the Hebrew testament and the book of Deuteronomy.

YHWH will once again delight in you and make you prosperous, just as God delighted in your ancestors and prospered them, if you obey YHWH, your God, and keep the commandments and decrees that are written in the Book of the Law, and return to YHWH with all your heart and soul.

For this Law I give to you today is not too difficult for you, nor is it beyond your reach. It is not up in heaven, so that you need not ask yourselves, "Who will go up to heaven for us and bring it down to us, so that we may hear it and keep it?" Nor is it beyond the seas, so that you need to wonder, "Who will cross the seas for us and bring it back for us, so that we may hear it and keep it?" No, the word of God is very near to you; it is in your mouth and in your heart, so that you can keep it.

Reader: Listen for the leading of the Spirit.

All: Thanks be to God.

PSALM

The psalm is written in your bulletin. Let us read it responsively.

I lift up my eyes to the hills; from where is my help to come?

My help comes from God, the maker of heaven and earth.

The Holy One, our God, watches over you; the Holy One is your shade at your side,

so that the sun shall not strike you by day, nor the moon by night.

The Holy One shall preserve you from all evil and shall keep you safe.

The Holy One shall watch over your going out and your coming in, from this time forth for evermore.

SECOND READING

A reading from Paul's letter to the Church in Ephesus.

From the time I first heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and your love for all of the holy ones, I have never stopped thanking God for you and remembering you in my prayers. I pray that the God of our Saviour Jesus Christ, the God of glory, will give you a spirit of wisdom and of revelation, to bring you to a rich knowledge of the Creator. I pray that God will enlighten the eyes of your mind so that you can see the hope this call holds for you – the promised glories that God's holy ones will inherit, and the infinitely great power that is exercised for us who believe.

You can tell this from the strength of God's power at work in Jesus, the power used to raise Christ from the dead and to seat Christ in heaven at God's right hand, far above every sovereignty, authority, power or dominion, and above any other name that can be named – not only in this age, but also in the age to come. God has put all things under Christ's feet and made Christ, as the ruler of everything, the head of the church, and the church is Christ's body; it's the fullness of the One who fills all of creation.
